Description

This monument, on a Bronze Age mound, marks the resting place of a horse named 'Beware Chalk Pit', which belonged to Paulet St John (1704-1780). In September 1733, it survived leaping into a twenty-five foot deep chalk pit whilst out hunting and the following year, carried its owner to racing victory, winning the Hunter's Plate at Worthy Down, Winchester. Exactly when the horse died, or when the monument was erected is uncertain, although the monument was almost certainly built before 1772, as its inscription does not mention St John's baronetcy.
