Copley Fielding exhibited 14 Scottish subjects in 1848.

This watercolour was bought at the Society of Painters in Water-colours by the Rev. Humphrey Waldo-Sibthorp who was born into an ancient Lincolnshire family, the 4th son of Col. Humphry Waldo-Sibthorp. Rev Humphrey served as Rector of Washingborough, Lincolnshire between 1817 - 1824, before serving as rector at Hatton, Lincolnshire until his death.

It later passed to Captain Sir Montague Aubrey Rowly Cholmeley 4th Baronet, was related to Rev. Sibthorp through his wife Mabel Janetta. Cholmeley was killed in action on Christmas Eve 1914, serving in the 2nd Battalion Grenadier Guards. They had one daughter, Rosamund Mary Edith (1904 - 1984), who also owned this watercolour.
